2. Project Summary and Objectives

AllB provides co-financing for the construction of 64 km of the four-lane, access-controlled national motorway M-4 connecting Shorkot and Khanewal in Punjab province (Package-3), which is also subdivided into Packages 3A and 3B. Both section 3A and 3B were completed and opened to traffic in Oct 2019. All major roads works have been completed while some remedial works (punch list) for 3B are still ongoing.

The objective of the Project will be the achievement of an efficient and safer transport corridor between Islamabad, Faisalabad, and Multan to ensure enhanced connectivity between the various parts of Pakistan.

6. Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

Two separate grievance redress mechanisms (GRMs) have been established for the project: one for the resettlement issue and the other for the environment-related complaints, approved by the client namely, the National Highways Authority and the lead financer, ADB. A Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) has been formed with 30 Affected Person Committees (APCs) (17 committees in Section 3A and 13 in Section 3B), headed by the Project Directors of the 3A and 3B sections.

As shared by ADB, both GRC and APC are not functioning in full due to lack of facilitations to NHA land Staff team but will be improved in next reporting period.
